How can we prevent nipple problems to continue breastfeeding?

What can be done to protect the nipple from skin problems, or to rectify problems caused by flat and/or inverted nipples?

Nipple Care Items

Nipple problems can make direct breastfeeding difficult. Pigeon is committed to protecting the nipple to permit continuous maternal feeding.

Nipple problems are most common within the first month since birth. The most common problems are cracked nipples and pain¹

When the mother's nipple is cracked, painful, dry, or irritated, direct breastfeeding becomes difficult. Pigeon researched mothers with 0-12 month old infants, and found that approximately 60% of mothers have experienced nipple problems. The problems occur mainly when the infant is within the first month since birth; approximately 70% of mothers experienced nipple-related problems around that time. The problems seem to abate by the time the infant is around 6 months old, at which point the potential for problems increases once again as infants begin to develop their own teeth (Fig.1).



Approximately 70% of mothers with newborns experience nipple problems in the first month.

Among the various nipple-related problems, cracking and pain are by far the most common, with an incidence of approximately 60% of mothers experiencing the problem. Problems related to nipple form abnormalities such as flat or inverted nipples are also observed frequently (Fig.2). To resolve these problems, creams are applied to treat cracking and pain, nipple shields are used to protect the affected area, and suction tools are used to correct flat or inverted nipples.

The most common nipple-related problems are cracking and pain, both experienced by approximately 60% of mothers.

Results of nipple cream research²⁾

Research on Pigeon's cream was conducted in January, 2013 among 25 nursing staff and 19 hospitalized breastfeeding mothers at hospitals and maternity clinics where nipple creams are used commonly. The majority of both the nursing staff and breastfeeding mothers responded that Pigeon's cream was not "sticky" or "smelly" like other products. Furthermore, the breastfeeding mothers' responses indicated that the Pigeon product felt more efficacious.
